Application for a Variation to an existing Premises Licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

## **Executive Summary**

The Premises Licence Holder, East Street (Horsham) Limited have made an application in respect of Wabi Restaurant, 38 East Street, Horsham, West Sussex, RH12 1HL.

The application seeks to extend the opening hours of the rear garden patio area till 01:00hrs Saturday and Sunday mornings. At present the existing premises licence as granted states the following:

 The rear garden patio area will be closed to the public for all activities between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00hrs the following day with the exception that it is used as a fire exit in the event of an emergency.

The variation application seeks to amend the times above to 01:00hrs and 07:00hrs, Saturday and Sunday only.

### **Background Information**

## 1 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 For the Sub-Committee to determine the application for a variation to the existing premises licence which seeks to extend the opening hours of the rear patio garden area.
- 1.2 On the 13<sup>th</sup> August 2015, Horsham District Council Licensing Department received an application for a variation of the existing premises licence from the Premises Licence Holder, East Street (Horsham) Limited. The application seeks to amend and extend the hours of operation in relation to the permitted hours the rear garden can be opened to customers.

At present the premises licence states the following:

The rear garden patio area will be closed to the public for all activities between the hours of 23:00hrs and 07:00hrs the following day with the exception that it is used as a fire exit in the event of an emergency.

The application submitted on the 13<sup>th</sup> August seeks to amend the above times to 01:00hrs and 07:00hrs on a Saturday and Sunday Morning.

- 1.3 The Principal Environmental Health Officer with Horsham District Council, submitted an objection to the grant of the variation application on the grounds of the following licensing objective, Prevention of Public Nuisance in that the application was to be granted would cause "potential noise and general disturbance to neighbouring residents living in the vicinity of the premises"
- 1.4 During the twenty eight (28) day consultation period, six (6) members of the public have submitted relevant objections to the grant of the variation of the application on the grounds of the following licensing objective: Prevention of Public Nuisance.

# 2 Relevant Council policy

2.1 Statement of Licensing Policy dated January 2014

#### 3 Details

3.1 This licensed premises has operated for many years with the existing premises licence being granted on the 09<sup>th</sup> April 2014 following a variation of the then licence. There has been a number of premises licence granted to these premises under both the Licensing Act 1964 and the present Licensing Act 2003.

The current premises licence permits the following licensable activities:

- The sale by retail and supply of alcohol.
- Performance of live music.
- Any playing of recorded music.
- Late night refreshment.
- 3.2 On the 13<sup>th</sup> August 2015, Horsham District Council Licensing Department received an application for a variation of the existing premises licence from the Premises Licence Holder, East Street (Horsham) Limited. The application seeks to amend and extend the hours of operation in relation to the permitted hours the rear garden can be opened to customers.

At present the premises licence states the following:

The rear garden patio area will be closed to the public for all activities between the hours of 23:00hrs and 07:00hrs the following day with the exception that it is used as a fire exit in the event of an emergency.

The application submitted on the 13<sup>th</sup> August seeks to amend the above times to 01:00hrs and 07:00hrs on a Saturday and Sunday Morning.

- 3.3 The Principal Environmental Health Officer with Horsham District Council, submitted an objection to the grant of the variation application on the grounds of the following licensing objective, Prevention of Public Nuisance in that the application was to be granted would cause "potential noise and general disturbance to neighbouring residents living in the vicinity of the premises"
- 3.4 During the twenty eight (28) day consultation period a total of six (6) relevant representations against the grant of the application were received by Horsham Districts Councils Licensing Department on the grounds of the following licensing objective: Prevention of Public Nuisance.

## 4 Next Steps

- 4.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
- 4.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also required to have regard to Guidance issued under the Section 182 Licensing Act 2003 (as amended) and the councils own Licensing Policy

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- 4.3 The Sub-Committee must take one of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives:
  - To permit the variation application
  - To reject the variation in whole or in part
  - To modify the conditions of the licence as they relate to the application
  - To exclude a licensable activity from the licence
- 4.4 The Sub Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the four licensing objectives.

#### 5 Outcome of Consultations

- 5.1 The application was advertised in the local newspaper covering the area (West Sussex County Times). Notices were also displayed on site and on Horsham District Councils website with accordance with the Statutory Requirements under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.2 A copy of the application was served on all statutory Consultees in accordance with the provisions contained within the Licensing Act 2003 and its associated regulations.



# Noise Management Plan for Wabi Rear Garden Patio Area

#### Introduction

As a professional operator we acknowledge that we have a primary responsibility to ensure that our premises do not generate excessive noise disturbance. The purpose of this Noise Management Plan is to detail the procedures we aim to adopt to ensure, as far as possible, the minimisation of disturbance to local residents by activities in and around Wabi's Rear Garden Patio Area.

A balance of needs must be achieved by ensuring social acitivity is not marred whilst controlling potential adverse noise effects. Our aims is to adopt the best practicable options to ensure that the conditions of the Licensing Act (2003) are met.

The plan has been developed with assistance from Horsham District Council and is designed to prevent public nuisance and meet the licensing objectives under the Licensing Act (2003). This plan will remain consistent in helping minimise and adverse impact on the natural environment.

All staff members employed by Wabi and those contracted from outside of the business (i.e. Security Contractors) will be made aware and trained to adhere to the Noise Management Plan. Records of this will be kept on file along with other training records.

With the Noise Management Plan, we have the following in place:

- Robust policies and procedures applied to the Wabi Rear Garden Patio Area.
- Training procedures for Management and other staff associated with Wabi.
- A detailed complaints monitoring system

#### The Key Elements of this Plan are:

- Minimise the impact on local residents
- To satisfy the Local Licensing Authority
- The identification of the range of potential noise sources relating to the premises and the acceptable levels of noise arising from the Rear Garden Patio Area
- A detailed list of steps to manage noise pollution
- A Complaints Procedure

#### Complaints Procedure

All complaints relating to Wabi should go via the Duty Manager.

If the complaint is related to licensable activities the Designated Premises Supervisor will be contacted immediately. The Designated Premises Supervisor will investigate the issue and take appropriate action to locate and remove the source and will then monitor the outcome.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and/or the General Manager will review the complaint and contact the complainant if possible the following day.

Should a response be required immediately (on the night) back to the complainant this will be done by the Duty Manager immediately after reporting to the Designated Premises Supervisor.

All complaints should be treated with utmost sympathy and politeness. With the correct attitude and politeness any issue can be defused quickly if not immediately. Wabi will always have an 'open door' policy to discuss issues with neighbours as we have always promoted our standing within the Horsham community.

# <u>Licensing Act 2003 - Wabi, East Street, Horsham</u> <u>Variation to open the rear garden patio area - 01:00hrs on Friday and Saturday</u>

I refer to the above application to vary the Premise Licence to extend the current hours of use for the rear external garden area. The applicant has submitted a Noise Management Plan and specified that there will be no music played in the garden. Its use is limited to patrons drinking & eating only. They also advise that the number of patrons using the patio after 23.00 will be limited to a maximum of 50 persons who will be supervised by a SIA Licensed Door Supervisor.

Wabi have applied for a number of Temporary Event Notices (TENs) in recent months to allow customers to use the external patio after 23.00. Environmental Health (EH) did not object to the TENs as we used the opportunity to monitor for complaints of noise from neighbouring residents. We did this in order to assess the legitimate aspirations of the business against the protection of local of residents from noise nuisance. Unfortunately we have received complaints of excessive noise from patrons using the external patio. As a result of the complaints EH objected to a recent application for a TEN to use the patio after 23.00.

This Department has serious concerns regarding this application due to potential noise and general disturbance to neighbouring residents living in the vicinity to the premises. Local residents are entitled to expect a fair degree of peace and quiet after the hours of 23.00.

During the later hours there is a significant reduction of background noise levels from traffic noise, etc. This reduction in background noise will intensify the impact of any direct noise source from persons speaking, shouting or laughing whilst using the external areas. Noise will be more intrusive especially when neighbours open windows in summer months.

The noise generated from 50 people is likely to be more intrusive when the ambient noise level is quieter. Another factor to take into consideration is that people socialising tend to become louder as the evening progresses. Such groups are difficult to manage and if asked to vacate the premises are likely to cause more disturbance once in the adjacent streets.

Therefore this department objects to this application on the grounds that it will undermine the licensing objective for the prevention of public nuisance.

I am writing to object to the application to serve alcohol in the garden of Wabi restaurant on East Street until 1 a.m. on Friday and Saturday nights. My reasons are as follows:

- 1. There will be an unacceptable level of noise from the garden causing a nuisance to local residents. This garden fronts and has access to Denne Road which has a significant proportion of residential properties.
- 2. There are sufficient outlets for late night drinking in Horsham without increasing or extending licenses the existing licenses.
- 3. The application is likely to increase the problems that already exist in Horsham, including drunken behaviour, vandalism, broken windows, shouting and screaming, litter, fighting, swearing and vomit.
- 4. Wabi already has an extension to their licence until 2.30 a.m. on Friday and Saturday and no further extension is necessary.
- 5. There is no adequate police or other presence to cope with the situation in central Horsham which is out of control.
- 6. Elderly residents in my road are afraid to go into the town centre at night because of the drunken behaviour.
- 7. A balance has to be struck and no further extension of licenses should be permitted unless there are exceptional reasons for doing so, which there are not in this case.
- 8. Horsham has a growing and serious public order problem caused by excessive drinking especially at weekends. It needs bringing under control by reduced licensing hours, stricter licence control and a more effective policing policy.

Dear Sir,

We would like to make a representation against the variation to the licence application made by East Street (Horsham) to extend the hours of operation of the rear garden of Wabi located at 38 East Street Horsham, from 23.00hrs to 0100 on a Friday and Saturday night on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance.

We enclose a scale plan of the area which shows the relationship with the front of our house, shown with a blue cross and the garden of Wabi – the distance shown by the red line is 30.5m. The front of our house, where are main bedroom is located is located, is therefore in close proximity and overlooks the garden of Wabi, though other residential properties are even closer, as you can see.

When the Wabi garden is occupied the noise from patrons in the garden is clearly audible in our bedroom. Whilst the noise is loudest in the summer when our windows are open for ventilation, as we are in a Horsham District Council conservation area and to maintain the appearance of our Victorian house, we have wooden sash windows which have limited noise attenuation – so we can clearly hear noise from the Wabi garden even when the windows are closed.

With the current garden closing time of 23.00hrs the issue is tolerable.

However, as a demonstration of how much nuisance this extension to the garden closing time would bring, on the night of Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> August 2015 we were unable to get to sleep after we went to bed shortly before 23.00hrs due to the noise from the patrons in the Wabi garden. We contacted Wabi at about 23.40 to enquire why the garden was still occupied, contrary to their license and were informed that they had a special extension until 00.00. We were unable to get to sleep until after the garden closed at midnight. Therefore it is reasonable to state that if the garden opening time was extended to 01.00 on Fridays and Saturdays, we would be unable to get to sleep until after this time when the garden is occupied with a number of Wabi customers, much of the time. As this is over two hours later than our normal bed time, this would be intolerable and is therefore totally unacceptable.


The garden was also cleared late last Friday, 21st August, which also delayed us getting to sleep.

It is worth noting that this proximity to local residents was the reason why the rear garden closing time was set at 23.00 in the original licence – the local residential occupation has not changed since, so nor should the licence.

We therefore consider that extending the garden closing time this late is completely inappropriate for licenced premises adjoining a residential area, and would cause real nuisance to local residents, as has already been demonstrated and therefore should not be accepted.

We would also like to request that you do not extend the garden closing time on an occasional adhoc basis.



"Wabi" - 38 East Street Horsham - application for extension of hours in respect of the rear garden

Regrettably, I cannot support this application.

As part of the substantial re-development associated with the establishment of "Wabi" as a quality restaurant, the existing garden area at the rear of the building was revamped to fit the image of the restaurant. Unfortunately, that revamp was unable to address sufficiently the preceding difficulty of noise egress and its impact on neighbouring residential properties.

Even within its current licensing hours, there have been occasions when the noise levels emanating from the garden have been considerably intrusive for nearby residents.

Extending the hours as requested will mean the likelihood of the occasional nuisance becoming a frequent feature, posing a serious detriment to the interests of nearby residents. For various reasons, the window for undisturbed sleep in this immediate locality is already very narrow, especially at weekends. As might be presumed, granting this application will not alleviate that problem but add to it.

I request, therefore, that the application be refused.
